Stones, windows, tiles...

So we are very busy with the construction of two houses in Romos. Thanks to the mayor we received a piece of land to build on, we could go to the mountains to collect all the wood we need to construct the roof and we received sand to make the cement.

Calin, a Roma friend, immediately offered us his services. He even wanted to help us for free cuz he has such a warm heart for us and our project. We accepted his offer but decided to pay him anyway cuz even he and his family have big needs. Not only does he take all the responsibility during the construction works, also did he find BCA-bricks at half price, went with us to the mayor, ...

Through Jan and Gerry, a Dutch couple, we received four windows and when we get home we can pick up a lot of roof tiles at their place. So all together it means that we saved a lot of money.

...and love

Unfortunately the mentality in Romos is not always how it should be, causing conflicts from time to time. Until now we were able to restore the piece every time. With His eyes of love we look at the people and that's something we really want them to learn also, 'love thy neighbor'.

It's amazing to see how two families, who are still way behind according to the other villagers, will soon also have a brick house. We're so thankful we can give them this new start in life. The houses won't be given immediately, of course they can move in as soon as they are ready, but the first three years they will remain property of Pe lunca. If they really proof themselves during these three years (taking care of themselves, their children, the house, ...), only then will we donate them their house. Of course, we have the full confidence that they will do their very best.



Pelunca Family Files

We call this project 'Pelunca Family Files', meaning: improving, renewing or constructing houses, so the houses would be warm and live able for the families.

Per house we're searching for 12 sponsors. Every sponsor would then contribute ≤ 25 /month during one year (total amount of ≤ 300). This means that after one year you really can make a difference. Not only by giving them a decent house but by helping us giving them a home. After that year every sponsor can choose whether they stop or continue for another year.

For now we only have one sponsor for these first two houses. So we still need like 23 more for now. It was a risky step we took by already starting with the construction but we're very confident it will succeed. It's a very beautiful thing for the poorest but also a very beautiful thing to do as a sponsor.

Geoagiu

We had some very interesting conversations with the mayor from Geoagiu. For the Roma village there we have a vision that we will share later (when it all will be a little more certain), but the mayor was very enthusiastic about it. He said that he's very open to help us wherever they can. Of course we stay with our feet on the ground and we'll see in time if that's true. To realize this vision we would first need a building. The mayor was willing to give us a building that we could use but it was to far away from the Roma village.

Orăsție

We continue praying for this and believe that God will open doors on His time. Meanwhile we continue the work we've been doing there the last year.

After having a conversation at the city hall of Orastie we also send a mail to the mayor there, cuz also in Orastie there are some things that we really hope to realize one day. At the side of a river there's small community of Roma. About 18 houses (of planks and carton) but they're standing on illegal ground. And absolutely no one is looking after them! We would therefore very much like to see that this mayor either gives them/us the ground or give us another piece of land where we can restart. These people don't have any drinking water, no (legal) electricity and especially at night they're often bitten by rats. They are really the poorest of the poorest, but they have a good mentality. It would be so beautiful to help them get a step, or even a few steps, further in life.

roofing, aid en strong guests!

The first day we achieved that they all have a metal roofing. So done with getting wet every time it rains. Of course we didn't do this alone. In the beginning of October Jan and Gerry received a group of students from a school in Holland and together with these enthusiastic people we got in action and renewed every roof. It was again a very intense time but we got to do what we planned to. Especially the boys from the group, and some tuff girls as well, accomplished this wonderful job. The other group (the rest of the girls) got active in our barn to sort a lot of clothes together with Jessica. All the boxes with jackets, hats, scarves, gloves and boots were put outside and were sorted per size and kind. A big job, even with a big team.

The next day we took all the boxes to the Roma village where the people could come, and guided by the girls they could choose what they needed the most.

The third day was the hardest: handing out shoes and boots. It's amazing to see how their survival mode gets the upper hand and they almost fought to just get a pair of shoes. Every parent desperately wanted a pair for their children. On one hand it sometimes hurts to see them acting like this, being sometimes disrespectful and even unthankful at first, but on the other hand it just makes it so clear that these people need so much help in so many different ways.

Again the Dutch girls did a wonderful job helping the people get watch they needed and we did everything we could to keep the peace. At the end of day three we handed out some food parcels as well. Thank you so much diligent students for you big effort! For a big part they also supported this financially and Jan and Gerry financed the rest of it. So you see what can be done if we all help each other.















Rats, volunteers and a baby!

Next time we aim for the outside of the houses so the rats won't be able to get in anymore. It's awful to see babies who has been bitten multiple times during one night. And they are really nasty bites!

Meanwhile we had our first requests for EVS (European Voluntary Service). This means that young people applied through Erasmus+ to come and help us as volunteers. We can have two students. So now we have to choose who we want and how many. Anyway, it's kinda exciting having somebody, we don't know, living with us for such a long period. But we believe that it will be a blessing for them, us and the people we work with. It will be great to divide our work a bit and maybe get some new ideas that way. Ow well, we'll see how everything goes. It would only be for the beginning of May. That means that it would be a perfect timing for us, especially with the new baby and so. [2]

Yep, you read it well, child number three or daughter number two is in the development phase. She's expected to see the light around the 11th of April. It's just such a perfect timing. Anyway we are in Belgium that period cuz we then have our annual fundraise and other presentations. Y'all get the exact date asap.

So half April we get our new baby, at the end of April we will be back in Romania and in the beginning of May we get extra help from the EVS-volunteer(s). That means that Jessica will be able to really enjoy the family expansion. So great how our sweat Lord arranges everything, isn't it?

So, I think our letter is long enough. We're quickly will go and make some paperwork in order while we're still a few days in Belgium. And hopefully we're back in time (at our hosts) cuz Hilde is preparing some tasty chicken and rice.
