




Raluca and baby Eremia

Those who've been following us probably saw the beautiful story of Raluca. We were able to pray for her with the whole BMT team and shared some affirming words that made clear God was with her. But for those unfamiliar with the story: Raluca is a very sweet mother of three and was pregnant with her fourth. A few months ago, she came to Jessica in a panic, telling her that the doctor had said there was a serious complication. The chances of her surviving childbirth were very slim. The doctor would first try to save her, and only then see if they could save the baby. We supported Raluca financially so she could continue medical check-ups, but things didn't look good. We prayed for her, BMT prayed for her, the church prayed for her, and her story was shared in many groups so even more people could pray

And then the time came: she went into labor. The frightened young mother was sent from pillar to post without explanation and eventually had to be transferred to another hospital two hours away. But Raluca kept her phone close and kept messaging with Jessica. In that way, we were at her side with words and deeds. And finally, the relieving message came. The birth was over, and Raluca was alive-praise the Lord! But what about the baby? The baby was taken away immediately to another facility. Only later that day did Raluca—and then we—hear the continuation of God's blessing; the baby was also alive. In an incubator, yes, but not in critical condition. How fantastic is that! Welcome, little Eremia! All honor and glory to our deeply compassionate Father!







Help for some familys

So Pe lunca is still far from quiet. The usual things—bookkeeping, home visits with the Roma, help with medicine, milk for babies, help with building materials-are all continuing. Thanks to a generous donation at the end of last year, we were able to help one family with new windows and doors. But not only that... There was still some money left from the donation, allowing us to help several more families. The sponsors of our family files also made this possible. We're grateful for your generous hearts. For example: (PFF28) Farcas Romolus and Ana received 4 pallets of bricks, cement, and plaster, (PFF18) Lidia and her little girl received 2 pallets of bricks with cement and plaster, The Paul sisters needed some cement and roofing sheets for repairs, (PFF25) Bacrau Saul and Alina got a new stove and paint to freshen up their home. This family still had a little budget left and wanted to use it to help someone else-Denisa.

Denisa gave birth to her fourth daughter about a month and a half ago. The baby was in bad shape and was transferred to a hospital in Timisoara. Denisa comes to us for diapers and clothes to take to her daughter, but she has no money to get there. So far, we've been able to help her travel there three times. Thank you, dear sponsor your donation made that possible. Due to the distance and Denisa's absence, she unfortunately no longer produces breast milk. We're now hoping to find a sponsor to help provide formula milk.

We also visited one of the local churches in the Roma village. A small church with a passionate heart for the Lord. I (Tijs) was immediately invited to preach, and they also asked us for help. We were able to bless them with metal roof-plates, and after I played a bit on their broken, cymbal-less drum kit with someone from the church, I got back in the car and said to Jessica, "I'm giving them my drum set." With both sadness and joy in my heart, I went back a few days later with my drum kit. Their joy was overwhelming!! May the Lord be praised, honored, and worshipped through it!

This has become a big part of Pe lunca. The center is incredibly important for the Roma kids and their future. That's why we want to invest directly in them. Would you please share our Facebook/Instagram group? That would be super sweet. We want to inspire many more people to get involved in the center's work. Amazing things are happening, but we still need helping hands. Simona (our paid staff) does her best, but she cannot manage alone. She really needs Jessica to guide her, but Jessica is constantly being called away by people from the village in need. That makes it hard to lead and also offer one-on-one support to some of the children. Especially with homework, the kids need individual help. So it's quite demanding. We're looking into how I can be more involved in the center myself, but right now I'm still fully occupied with home renovations, preparing for visitors and groups, the website, bookkeeping, emails, sermons, and of course, caring for our own children... So we continue to pray for more finances and the right people to work with us.







Thankfully, we were able to recharge a bit at the beginning of May during a three-day worship conference in Arad. The kids stayed with someone from church, so we could fully focus on God's Word, study, worship, and fellowship. It was especially helpful for Jessica, who—as most of you know—is a worship leader in our church. We're definitely raising the bar for her now, haha.

Our summer plans also took a sudden turn. We had originally planned to come to Belgium again in the second half of August. But our home team was hoping we could attend the 10th edition of the benefit event (a Flemish fair with a walking tour). After some reshuffling, we made it work—so our two weeks in Belgium have moved from August to June. Last year's benefit was truly beautiful, and this year promises to be even better. We've done everything to be there—so you will be too, right?! Unfortunately, our kids will have to miss their last week of school for it. For Lowie, that's even his last week with teacher Ana, after four years. His final week at that school. All of this so we can see everyone at the benefit 2 Get it? I mean... Hihi. Alright, I'll stop trying to guilttrip you! See you at the benefit then:D
