The afternoons were packed with cool games or nature walks. In the evening: Varmaga TV with funny photos from the week, followed by skits, worship, teaching, and prayer time. And once everyone was supposed to be in bed, we had the privilege of running up and down the stairs about 100 times an hour because they just wouldn't sleep 2. So, a heavy, intense week, but such a blessing for all of us!

These words deeply touched us. Before, we would invite them now and then to our home or church, but it was always a bit of a struggle. Now that the desire is coming from them, we're going all in. A new project is being born under Pe lunca: PYM (Pe lunca Youth Ministry). We want to meet weekly at our home, go to church more often together, and do outings from time to time-we're fully on board!
